The Museum is focused on the study and promotion of contemporary Greek art and houses a large collection of works of Greek artists of the 19th and 20th centuries. In September 2009, Teloglion will open an exhibition of about 400 pieces of art by Huan Miró from the permanent collection of the Pilar i Joan Miro Mallorca Foundation.

The Conference Program includes plenary, invited and oral presentations, and poster presentations. The Conference will publish an extended abstract proceedings volume. The abstracts, written in English, can be up 2-pages long and should be submitted electronically before **April 30, 2009**.
